

Third Grade Summer Packet

Dear Parents,

Attached you will find the items for your child to complete over the summer. In the Fall, we will want to get started with our learning right away, so it is essential that during the summer, each student keeps up those reading and math skills that he or she has been working so hard on in 2nd grade!

For **Summer Reading**, I have chosen two books. All students need to choose one of the following fiction books and do a short book report on it, using the included book report form. The two fiction books that they can choose from are: *Freckle Juice* by Judy Blume and *Friendle* by Andrew Clements. Students also need to read at least 15 minutes, 4 times a week. More is better!!! I am including a reading log for your child to record the books that he/she reads over the summer.

For **Math**, our school has adopted a new computerized math program that we will continue to use next year called Mathletics. This summer, we are requiring that students log into Mathletics (they will get their login info. before the end of this year), and earn at least 4 certificates. Each certificate should take about an hour, BUT they can ONLY earn ONE certificate per week, so they will need to plan ahead, because they will not be able to cram in all 4 certificates the week before school starts. I tell you this because I am a parent, and I know how summer can go by quickly!

I will be collecting the book reports, reading logs, and Mathletics certificates (just print them out) in August at the beginning of the school year. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to email me at andrews@basilicaschool.com.


