Freckle continuously adapts to each student's individual skills, so they get the appropriate challenge whether they're working at, above or below grade level. Within Freckle, your child will benefit from lessons, videos and multiple chances to continue improving their math skills over the summer.

Freckle is accessible 24/7, wherever an internet connection is available. The student logs in to Renaissance, using the same URL, username and password that they use for Accelerated Reader.

Step 4: Enter AR Username/Password

examples of biography items

Some biography in a bag items are obvious like a stethoscope if they were a doctor or a basketball if they were an NBA star, but I try to encourage my students to be creative and bring in items that symbolize their person as a character and dig deeper.

**You may only want to share a few just to give them an idea... sometimes students will bring in every example you give them for their biography. I model first. I read aloud a short biography to the class, complete the report, and brainstorm items that could represent the historical figure. This sets the expectations and gives students clear guidelines.

Here are some examples:

TV remote to "mute" out all the negative comments

Energizer battery she kept going and going, perseverance

lion very brave

Owl wisdom, intelligence

Heart caring, kind, thoughtful

Soccer ball achieved their goals

Open door never turned anyone away

Weights strong, powerful

Bird fought for freedom

Candle/match sparked hope in others
